Its groundbreaking curriculum and faculty experts prepare fellows to provide integrated care through delivery of consultation to non-mental health settings (such as primary care), to consult via telepsychiatry, and to improve systems of care through innovative leadership.

Trainees can customize their experience by focusing on specific clinical conditions or populations (such as Pediatrics or Perinatal). Training activities focus on:

- Quality Improvement
- Data-driven Care
