Integrated Care Fellowship

Patient-centered, high-quality mental health care requires providers to focus on population health. Our Integrated Care Fellowship at the University of Washington prepares fellows for population-based health care by providing information on health care systems, defining roles within these systems, and developing skills that contribute to better mental health outcomes.

Participants in this program will develop the skills needed to provide effective mental healthcare to a variety of populations, such as:

- Leadership Skills
- Understanding Health Care Systems
- Clinical Skills

Trainees can customize their experience and focus on specific clinical conditions or populations (such as Pediatrics or Perinatal). Training activities will include:


- Clinical rotations in Collaborative Care model and other consultation models
- Learning about quality improvement in health care and doing a project with supervision
- More in depth knowledge about Telepsychiatry and using it to provide care in different integrated care models
- Didactic series focusing on clinical and system-based topics on population-based care
