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
### **Treatment Landscape**



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

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# **Rural Barriers to Treatment**




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### Distance



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# **Overcoming Distance Barrier**

- Take public health approach (harm reduction)
- Focus on minimizing barriers to medications not on UDS
- Tolerate no shows and drop ins
- Incorporate telephone visits
- Use Sublocade



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### **Overcoming Lack Of Specialists/inpatient facilities**

- Call upon primary care roots
- Local waiver training
- Develop local expertise
- Care navigators
- Teleconsults
- Collaborative care

- Community Presentations


   Including native communities

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### **Overcoming Complex Mental Health Comorbidities**

- Improve PCP knowledge
   UW PACC
- Implement Collaborative Care
- Telemedicine psychiatry
- Community Partnerships



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### **Overcoming Complex Pain Management Challenges**

- Help providers identify OUD in chronic pain patients
- Use buprenorphine early
- Use adjuncts SNRI, pregabalin, TCA
- Aggressively treat depression
- focus on quality of life
- Get physical therapy on board
- Research




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### **Overcoming lack of PCP prescribers**

- Primary care approach
- •Develop the team

–Fund Nursing, CHW, Navigators

- •Local expertise, peer support
  - –Nursing Navigators and Providers
- •Keep your phone on
- •Train Rural Residents
