CASE: MEET KIRK

- 59 year old man, married, trucker
- Seeing his PCP for pain and back issues for the last year, has seen other providers in Utah and CA over the last 15 yrs for same issues
- Referred by his PCP to behavioral health provider in the clinic – to address mood and pain issues, PHQ-9 18
- Meds: Tylenol daily, tizanidine for back spasms
