About this Program:

The University of Washington's Department of Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences is excited to offer a new learning series for PCPs. This is a cohort-based series designed to help PCPs enhance their knowledge, skills, and confidence in managing common mental health conditions in primary care.



Topics Covered:

- Mood Disorders (Depression, Bipolar)
- Anxiety Disorders
- Trauma
- ADHD

Time Commitment:

- 6 months, Aug. – Dec. 2026, up to 18 hours total:
 - 2 hours per month for online, self-paced activities
 - 1 hour per month for a Zoom call (e.g., Monday, 12-1pm PST)

Program Objectives:

By the end of this learning series, participants will:

- Increase their confidence in selecting appropriate first- and second-line pharmacological treatments for common mental health conditions that present in primary care.
- Incorporate brief, evidence-informed behavioral interventions (can be used in a 15–20-minute appointment) for adult populations and for a range of common mental health conditions.
